Petition of the Union Pacific Railroad Co. for a Determination of the Adequacy of Warning Devices at the Grade Crossings of Its Tracks with CTH "E" in the Town of Randolph and CTH "H" in the Town of Scott, Columbia County

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Office of the Commissioner of Railroads (OCR) previously issued an order that required the installation of 12" LED automatic flashing lights, gates and constant warning time circuitry at the public crossing of the Union Pacific Railroad Co. (UP or railroad) tracks with CTH "E" in the Town of Randolph and CTH "H" in the Town of Scott, Columbia County by December 31, 2004 (Crossing Nos. 179 194F and 179 201N).

By letter dated October 25, 2004, the UP filed a request for an extension of time to June 30, 2005. The Commissioner finds the request to be reasonable and extends the deadlines accordingly. The deadline for installation of pavement markings is likewise extended.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED,

1. That the **Union Pacific Railroad Co.** shall install and maintain 12" LED automatic flashing lights, gates, constant warning time circuitry and other appropriate appurtenances in accordance with such plans as are filed with and approved by the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads at the crossing of its tracks with **CTH 'E'** at-grade in the Town of Randolph, Columbia County by **June 30, 2005** (Crossing No. 179 194F).
2. That the **Union Pacific Railroad Co.** shall install and maintain 12" LED automatic flashing lights, gates, constant warning time circuitry and other appropriate appurtenances in accordance with such plans as are filed with and approved by the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads at the crossing of its tracks with **CTH 'H'** at-grade in the Town of Scott, Columbia County by **June 30, 2005** (Crossing No. 179 201N).
3. That **Columbia County** shall install and maintain pavement markings on each approach to the CTH 'E' and CTH 'H' crossings by **June 30, 2005**.
4. That jurisdiction is retained.
